## **Advent Wreath Blessings**

Each Sunday of Advent, we light the Advent Wreath with a blessing after the Prelude. This year we are using blessings written by the Reverend Matthew Kozlowski, a seminary classmate of Patricia's who know works in the Center for Ministry in Teaching at Virginia Theological Seminary.

In this series of blessings, each candle has a meaning:

First Sunday of Advent –1st blue candle:

-HOPE

Second Sunday of Advent – 2<sup>nd</sup> blue candle:

-PEACE

Third Sunday of Advent – pink candle:

-JOY

Fourth Sunday of Advent – 3<sup>rd</sup> blue candle:

**-LOVE** 

Christmas Eve – center white candle:

-CHRIST

# Spiritual Life Team

The four weeks of Advent ("Coming") are devoted to preparation for the Feast of the Nativity (Christmas). The Liturgical color of blue is frequently used during Advent. Greenery is used to decorate the sanctuary. The lighting of the Advent Wreath by families begins each of the Advent services. Rose Sunday is the on the third Sunday in Advent. On the fourth Sunday in Advent we come together in one service celebrating "Lessons and Carols" with readings and music.

The color White, symbolizing joy, purity and truth is used during the Christmas Season, which extends from the eve of Christmas until the Baptism of Our Lord. A Christmas tree and poinsettias, along with the greenery, decorate the sanctuary. The Epiphany of Our Lord Jesus Christ is celebrated on January 6<sup>th</sup>.

We invite each person to participate in the beautiful services that surround the Advent and Christmas seasons.

  - 10:30 pm singing, 11:00 pm service
- Dec 25: Christmas Day (no services)
- Jan 1: regular services
- Jan 6: Epiphany service (6:00 pm)
