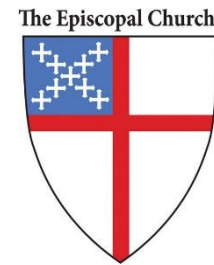

Dear All Saints' Community,

This November, we celebrate All Saints Day and the 60th anniversary of the consecration of All Saints' Church. We pause to remember our parishioners who have died, and it is a long list of faithful servants who imagined this church, built this church, and sustained this church. Those early families were visionaries who committed themselves financially, physically, and spiritually to building a church community.

We who attend All Saints' today are beneficiaries of their legacy, but we now need to be the visionaries for the All Saints' Church of the future. Church looks very different now than it did in 1959, both nationally and at All Saints'. Dramatic social changes have happened, attendance has dropped in all mainline Protestant denominations, and there is a rise in the number of "Nones" (no church at all) and "Dones" (those who have left church). Yet, for those who attend frequently and participate in what All Saints' has to offer, there is still a strong and loving community to be found here.

What hopes do you have for the next 60 years of All Saints'? What can church be for you individually and for the wider community in the coming years? What legacy can we leave for the ones to come? The Giving Tree



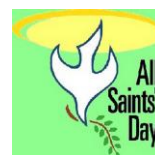
Dear All Saints' Family,
