

women's  
prison**



Our next Eucharist at the prison is on **Sunday, October 28<sup>th</sup> at 8am.** If you would like to attend this service and need prison orientation or a renewal of your orientation, please contact Patricia ASAP.

Also, the weekly Blessing & Healing Circle which Patricia organized over two years ago with three other priests, will be ending on August 30<sup>th</sup>. Administrative conditions at the prison have become more and more difficult in the past year as hundreds of additional women were transferred into the prison. Almost every week now there are difficulties with being able to hold our group (lockdowns, counts, double counts, women not allowed to leave their units despite signing up for the group, etc.). The

participating priests have decided to end the program with the end of our study of the Gospel of Matthew, which will be on August 30.

We are grateful for the opportunity to celebrate the healing Eucharist and study scripture with the women at Camille Griffin Graham Correctional Institute over these years, and we hope that in the future we can find another way to serve this prison population.

What can I say about the greatness and generosity of our parish? Only that you are the best ever! We may be small, but we are mighty. When it comes to helping others, we are right there with the bigger churches! With your support, we were able to fill 22 book bags for Cayce Elementary right here in our community. Your donations will go to the neediest students of the school. The new guidance counselor is Morgan Smith. She will make sure that these kids get a

brand new book bag filled with supplies so that on their first day, they will be ready to go. Thank you so much to those that donated supplies and monetary donations. Words cannot thank you enough. Without you, we couldn't succeed in this project. Also, thank you to Kelby Kenner and Arpina for helping me put supplies in the book bags!

A little FYI about Cayce Elementary. There are 1,040 students registered at the school so far. There are seven schools in Lexington District 2 that are a Title 1 school. Cayce Elementary is a Title 1 school, meaning that they get federal funds to support various programs that would not normally be available. These funds help with teachers and teacher assistants for small group instruction, materials and supplies for instruction, parenting initiatives, summer programs, and many others. All students in the school are provided with free breakfast. About ninety percent of the

students are on free lunch. The remainder are either on reduced pay or full pay. You can see why so many of these students are needy. As an added note, the teachers only get \$200 per year for supplies for their classroom. No increase for the last twenty years!

The new principal is Andrew Drozdak. I was able to meet him when I brought the book bags to the school. He was full of praise for our work (book bags and Christmas gifts) that we do for Cayce Elementary and asked me to thank you all. There are plenty of opportunities to volunteer. If anyone would like to volunteer to be a mentor or read to a child or listen to a child read, please let me know. There's also one-on-one math, too!

Again, thank you so much. You have made 22 kids have a smile on their face! May our Lord continue to bless YOU as you have blessed others. Delores Goodwin

### OCTOBER 20th "Holy Smokes BBQ!!!




